SUBJECT: Winter Storms: Are You Prepared?

Winter weather brings cold, ice, snow and high winds to the Puget Sound Region. To help deal with these conditions, the Prevention Division of Gig Harbor Fire & Medic One offers the following advice:

- Know what winter storm WATCHES and WARNINGS mean. A winter storm WATCH means a winter storm is possible in your area. A winter storm WARNING means a winter storm is headed for your area.
- Gather essential supplies, including flashlights, a radio, first aid kit, protective clothing and winter wear, canned foods, and enough water to last 5-7 days.
- Listen to NOAA Weather Radio, The Weather Channel, and local television broadcasts for the latest information about storm conditions.
- Plan to stay at home during bad weather, but if you must drive and become stuck, stay with your car. Do not try to walk to safety.
- Use a flashlight if the power is out at home. Do not use candles or other open flames indoors. More people have died after recent winter storms from residential fires caused by candles than from the direct effects of the storm itself.
- Use portable space heating equipment very carefully. Keep heaters at least three feet away from any combustible material, including drapes, carpeting, and furniture. Do not drape gloves, socks, or other clothing over a space heater to dry. Turn space-heating equipment off when you are not in the room. Keep children and pets away from heating equipment. Fuel-filled equipment should be filled outdoors when completely cool.
- Check to make sure your CO alarms and smoke alarms are working.

Winter storms can happen quickly and sometimes without warning. The Prevention Division urges Gig Harbor/Peninsula residents to get ready for winter weather now, while there is time to prepare.
